During the week students delivered information about: what happened during the horrifying years of WW2 in relation to the Holocaust, what the Holocaust involved, why it is remembered, how it is marked around the world and the wider lessons.

# VEX ROBOTICS AT GOLDINGTON ACADEMY



On 25<sup>th</sup> January the Regional Finals of the VEX robotics UK competition took place at Goldington Academy. Lots of schools attended the event with 21 teams altogether. Lockheed Martin organised the finals and there was an opportunity to look at engineering careers as future prospects for pupils. The year 10 Girlbots won the Judges Award. VR headsets and the latest technologies were showcased and used. Coding, building, programming, science and maths are all involved in order for the robots to be constructed. At times some of the robots had to be rebuilt but this process helped the pupils recognise what to improve and how to better plan and construct the robots. It was a very tense atmosphere with lots of hard work and concentration.

# HPQ QUALIFICATIONS PROJECT – UNIVERSITY OF BEDFORDSHIRE



On 24<sup>th</sup> January year 10 pupils had the opportunity to gain the Higher Project Qualification (HPQ) with the University of Bedfordshire which enabled them to research and discuss projects of interest.
