The performances involved lots of rehearsals and attending clubs at the academy to practise in groups, individually and in pairs. It is a chance to showcase a variety of creativity to music, sequencing, dance, and gymnastics in front of a big audience.

# **INTERVIEW WITH MRS CHAPMAN – HEAD OF GIRLS' PE:**

Mrs Chapman is the Head of Girls' PE and the Associate Assistant Head. Her interview below details what the gym and dance show entails and how much hard work is put into organising shows like this.

# Q. How long has the gym and dance show been running at Goldington Academy?

A. It has been running for approximately 15 years.

# Q. What does the gym and dance show involve?

A. The show involves: organising over 140 pupils/staff, ensuring that the numbers are finished by a deadline, holding lots of clubs, rehearsals and practice sessions and running auditions for solos, duets and small groups.

# Q. There are 2 shows - 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> February, why is this?

A. There are two shows so that everybody who wishes to see it is able to do so. There are 200 people watching per evening.

# Q. Why is the gym and dance show popular and why has it been running for so long?

A. I think this is because pupils enjoy the chance to be creative and show off what they can do.

# Q. How are the performances put together in order to keep the audience interested?

The performances involve having a variety of routines and music, making sure that everyone gets a chance to shine and some of the numbers are maintained by the advanced dancers and gymnasts. This is so that the more difficult movements can be performed by them.

# Q. Were there any particular parts that you enjoyed *especially*?

A. Recognising that all the performers were excited and enjoyed performing, and identifying that the parents were really proud of their children.

# Q. How can students who are interested get involved with next year's performance?

A. Go along to the Gym and Dance clubs which are open to everyone.
