### REMEMBRANCE DAY ACTIVITIES

Students took part in a number of activities to celebrate and mark Remembrance Day. Mr Galbraith and our teachers also arranged a remembrance assembly to signify this special occasion. The pupils that attend DT club, which runs at lunchtimes, have been busy creating incredible poppies made from recycled materials. They have been displayed in our garden area alongside a
