## Year 11 post-16 applications and pathways

I enclose information about our local post-16 providers, their entry requirements and their application deadlines, where available. In many cases, applications will be open longer for external applicants (i.e. Goldington students). The exception is Kimberley College which is very popular and over-subscribed, so I would recommend students wishing to apply do so online as soon as possible by their November deadline.

Students will be given their GCSE target grade information on 10 November – these are the grades they should include on their post-16 application forms.

All applicants will be asked to provide a standard reference from the school. Students' form tutors will be writing the references, using information gathered from all aspects of school life (punctuality, attendance, extra-curricular activities, attainment) and students will be completing a form outlining further information about their interests and post-16 pathways during Life Skills lessons to help with the reference process.

Students will usually be required to write a personal statement as part of their application. These skills were covered during the summer term of Year 10 during the Life Skills module, together with interview techniques, personal branding and writing a CV. There is also valuable information and guidance available for students and parents via the Careers section of our school website, and for students on the Unifrog careers platform and the Barclays Life Skills website.

It should be noted that students do not need to finalise their choice of place for September 2022 until their GCSE results day and can therefore apply for as many places as they would like to.

Upcoming virtual open days/evenings will continue to be shared via our social media sites, Show My Homework, and the daily tutor time bulletin.

Our careers advisor, Faye Gadsby, is in school every Thursday and students can request an appointment or lunchtime drop-in session via their form tutor or myself.

You have to be in some form of recognised study or training until your 18th birthday – you can do Apprenticeships and Traineeships, for example, but couldn't go straight into a full-time job.

You will have plenty of options to choose from when it comes to education, training or entering the world of work after you get your GCSE results.

- Vocational qualifications
  - GCSEs don't have to lead to A Levels. You might find that vocational qualifications like BTECs and Tlevels are a better option because they're a practical springboard into a career that involves hands-on learning.
- A Levels
  - You can check with your several local sixth forms and colleges to find out what's involved in studying A Levels.
- Apprenticeships
  - Apprenticeships are a way to combine earning a salary, building experience and learning to gain a qualification.
