#### The features of major sporting

#### events.

- Regularity/scheduling, i.e. 'one off' or regular.
- Regular and recurring
- International element
- Level of investment, i.e. required or which may be attracted
- Potential legacy, i.e. sporting, social or economic.

#### The potential drawbacks of cities/countries hosting major sporting events.

- Bidding to host can be expensive
- Event can cost hosts more than it raises in revenue
- Facilities can end up not being used
- Can have negative impact on the status of the country if ran poorly.
- Other sports may suffer
- Can cause division in the country

#### Potential benefits of cities/countries hosting major sporting events.

- Investment in developing transport systems
- Commercial benefits
- Increased direct and indirect tourism
- Infrastructure can be used by people who live in the area
- Sports facilities will be improved
- Raise the status of the country
- Morale of the country is raised.





#### 1) Promotion

- Promoting participation (e.g. equal opportunities policies)
- Increasing the popularity of the sport (e.g. schemes for schools)
- Exposure in the media (e.g. press releases, public relations)

#### 3) Support

- Providing technical advice (e.g. England Hockey provides information about playing surfaces).
- Providing location and contact details for local clubs.

#### 5) Policies and initiatives

- Anti-doping policies
- Promoting etiquette and fair play
- Community programmes
- Information and guidance on safeguarding.



#### 2) Development

- Elite training and development (e.g. national teams)
- Coaching awards (e.g. England Netball UK Level 1)
- Training of officials (e.g. Rugby Football Union has a young officials award)






