









This amazing book tells the story of Paul Kalanithi. At the age of thirtysix he was close to completing his 10 year training as a neurosurgeon and achieving his dream. Then he was diagnosed with inoperable lung cancer. In one moment he switched from being a medical student and doctor into being a patient.

While this may sound an upsetting





AUTHOR VISIT—SUE WALLMAN!

As part of our World Book Day celebrations thriller author Sue Wallman visited the school. Sue has published 7 thriller books for young adults, her most recent being *Every Word a Lie* which is about a catfishing killer!

Sue kicked off the day with a whole year talk to Year 9. Sue spoke about how she got started in her writing career and how the publication of her books is managed. It was intriguing to hear her speak about the publication process—particularly in how little say she has in her book covers!





After the talk Sue held creative writing workshops with selected Year 7, 8 and 9 pupils. During the workshops Sue spoke about the important elements of thriller writing. Pupils then collaboratively created the "main character" for a thriller book, and started putting together the outlines of a plot. Everyone finished by writing the first line of their killer thrillers!

In what turned out to be a very busy day Sue also found time to chat to pupils and to sign books. It was great to see so many pupils inspired by her talk and workshops and Sue was very impressed with both the creative ideas pupils came up with and the excellent behaviour of our pupils.



Vouchers will be available in the Library until the end of term if you need to pick one up. STAFF READS





Daisy has always been haunted: by her troubled past...and by the "wise creatures", who used to whisper to her from the walls of her house.


After many years the wise creatures have returned and are targeting Nina, her beloved sister. What can they want this time?

If you have a love of Marvel comics and films then this great comic collection is for you.




Before embarking on a career path it is important to think very carefully about what will make you happy and fulfilled. This book is designed to help you do just that!
