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Dear parent/carer,

We are acutely aware of how challenging the uncertainty over Year 11 GCSEs has been for pupils, parents and their teachers. Although the volume of information contained in this booklet may initially appear daunting, it is our aim that both you and your child will have all the information you need to be able to effectively plan for the next few weeks of internal assessment.

The booklet is split into two main parts:

- a) A schedule of *when* the assessments will take place, including the week, the date and the specific lesson;
- b) Some guidance from each curriculum leader about *what* will be assessed and how modifications and adaptations have been made to account for your child's lost learning time.

We would encourage you to read through the booklet thoroughly and hone in on the advice given for the subjects that are relevant to your child. This will help you to focus on the specific areas of study that are to be assessed and which topics will not be assessed and therefore do not need to be revised. The timetable will also appear more manageable if you can extract the sessions that are relevant to your child. It is recommended that your child draw up their own assessment timetable along with a plan for *when* they will be revising and *what* they will be revising. Blank revision timetables for your child to use are available in the Year 11 section of our website.

The majority of the evidence-gathering will take place within the students' normal timetables and will not therefore feel as pressurised or as stressful as a normal exam season. We will be doing everything we can in school to reduce anxiety and create a sense of routine and normality for our young people. It is inevitable however, at this stage of Year 11, that the students will need to work hard and be focused in their revision so that they are able to evidence the progress they have made in each of their chosen subjects. We will support them through assemblies and form times, but if you feel your child would benefit from additional support - emotionally or academically - please do contact Miss Lambe, Head of Year 11 in the first instance. lambea@goldington.beds.sch.uk





English	Over the next few weeks, English students will be displaying the breadth of the curriculum that they have studied, completing all aspects of their literature content* (aside from the poetry anthology that was previously removed) in the security of the classroom and with prior knowledge of the character or theme on which they will be answering. * <i>Macbeth, An Inspector Calls, A Christmas Carol, Unseen poetry</i> For language, we will seek to collect evidence of particular questions where there are gaps, or improvements needed from the previous attempts, such as long mark answers in the papers and with the writing components.
Maths	To assess pupils in maths, we will be using 6 half papers each 40 marks (45 minutes). All 6 papers will contribute to pupil's final grade. 2 papers will be non-calculator and there will be 4 calculator paper to represent the usual 1 non-calculator and 2 calculator papers. Pupils will sit one half paper per week throughout the half term (apart from w/c 19/4). A week before pupils sit their paper they will be able to access a list of topics covered in that paper and suggested revision resources for some areas. The best way to learn maths is to practice it so we would encourage pupils not just to watch videos but complete example questions on topics too.
Science	Students will sit three exams beginning w/c 19 <sup>th</sup> April – one each for Biology, Chemistry and Physics. Each assessment will be 1 hour 10 minutes long for Combined Science and 1 hour 45 minutes for Separate Science students. We study Edexcel Science, which splits all subjects into 2 papers. Students will be completing paper two in biology and physics and paper one in chemistry. In addition to the revision checklist which they have previously been given, their teachers will also be detailing the content which will be assessed. <i>Please note that students need a calculator for these assessments.</i> <i>We recommend the same Casio scientific calculators as the maths department. In all science assessments there are questions that require the application of maths skills.</i>

Art	Art and Design is 100% coursework based this year. Students will be assessed by their art teachers against the four art assessment objectives in exactly the same way they would have been in a normal year. Since the start of Year 10, students have been producing their coursework through the development of the Natural Forms project and the Transport project. Some students were able to complete a third project titled Reimagined Landscapes and this will also be considered within their assessment if successful.
	To assess pupils in Computer Science we will be using 2 reduced papers: one for Component 1: Computer systems and one for Component 2: Computational thinking, algorithms and programming. This will best replicate the structure as it is should have been.
Computer Science	Pupils will sit each reduced paper within their timetabled Computer Science lesson during the weeks commencing 17 <sup>th</sup> and 24 <sup>th</sup> May. In the weeks leading up to these papers, students will continue to revise the theory in lesson, complete walking-talking mock questions as well as workbook activities. Homework will be revision centred, focusing on the revision guides they have been issued (both electronic and CGP book) as well as the online resources such as GCSEpod, Seneca and Craig 'n' Dave.
Creative iMedia	Creative iMedia will be assessed using a range of evidence. Students will be asked to complete past paper questions from Unit R081, improving unit R082 Coursework (Creating Digital Graphics) and the completion of R087 Coursework (Creation of an Interactive Multimedia product).
Dance	Assessments of practical work will consist of choreography and the set phrases with a workshop on duet work if needed. Section A, B and C of the written paper will be assessed separately within lessons.
Design Technology	Pupils in Design Technology will be graded using the original principle of 50% non-examined assessment (NEA) and 50% theory. Their current NEA will be assessed in accordance with the set marking criteria, and the theory content will be extruded from two sets of theory assessment papers taken next half term to determine their overall grade.

	All work will be marked using the exam board mark schemes and grade descriptors.
	In addition to this evidence, holistic judgment will be made taking into consideration the individual pupils past performance.
Enterprise & Marketing	Pupils will have their TAG awarded through a combination of their coursework and exam unit worth 50% each. Pupils will be recapping the key topics for their lessons with the exam taking place on the week commencing 4th of May in their lessons. This will be a full paper. During the following 2 weeks, pupils will have smaller assessments, also taking place within their lessons.
French	The assessment for GCSE French will be based on the listening, reading and writing papers that students sat in December combined with listening and reading papers that students will sit in the April exam week. Pupils will complete a writing paper, broken up into its individual essay questions, over two lessons in March and May. All three skills will be of equal weighting, as per the normal GCSE.
	Students' speaking skills will also be assessed in dedicated lessons in April and May and this will count towards the speaking endorsement.

Geography	We are using four internal assessments which comprise of section A and B from both Paper 1 (physical geography) and Paper 2 (human geography). The assessments will focus on the content that has been taught to the students prior to lockdown and will assess the full range of skills the students would have been assessed on had they sat the exam.
Health & Social Care	Students will be working to complete and develop internal assessment units of work, RO22 - Communicating and working with individuals in health, social care and early years settings and RO31 - Understanding basic first aid procedures
History	GCSE history pupils will undertake, in total, six assessed questions on which their final grade will be based. Four of these six questions will be examined in a one-hour assessment on the Asia unit. The other two questions will be drawn from the Health and the People unit.
Hospitality & Catering	Students will complete the written element of the Non- Examination Assessment.
Music	<ul> <li>Music will be assessed with a portfolio of the following components:</li> <li>a recorded performance (30% of the final grade);</li> <li>a composition, with a detailed write-up and annotated score (30%);</li> <li>a series of listening and appraising tasks, based on selected sections, from the Areas of Study (40%).</li> </ul>
PE (GCSE)	<ul> <li>GCSE PE Teacher Assessed Grades (TAGS) will be awarded in four ways:</li> <li>1. Paper 1 exam focusing on the physical factors affecting performance. Religious	There will be a 1 hour 45-minute assessment during P4 and

	Students will be assessed on Relationships and Families on Friday 7 <sup>th</sup> May P4, and Religion and Life on Friday 21 <sup>st</sup> May P4. Lessons will continue before/after school tailored to support students in achieving in these assessments.
Spanish	Students will sit papers in listening, reading and writing after the Easter holidays. Results from previous listening, reading and writing assessments taken in Year 11 will also be considered, if appropriate. All three skills will be of equal weighting, as per the normal GCSE.
Travel & Tourism	In BTEC Travel & Tourism, the Year 11 students are currently completing the final assignment of three, this is Component 3. This assignment will be marked and moderated internally and then the student marks will be sent to the exam board for sampling and verification. All students received a 'Centre Assessed Grade' (CAG) in Year 10 for both Component 1 and 2.
